Construction Work Hours

According to the Town's Code of Ordinances, work is allowed Monday through Saturday, from 7 a.m. until 9 p.m. Commercial construction is not allowed on Sundays unless it is an emergency or approved in writing by the town manager. Residential construction is permitted on Sundays from 12:00 p.m. until dusk. If there are loud construction noises outside the permitted hours, please report the concern on the Town's website or, if it is an emergency, dial 911.

Morrisville has instituted the ReadyWake! Emergency Notifications System — an ultra high-speed telephone communication service for emergency notifications. This system allows us to contact all residents or targeted areas of the Town in case of an emergency situation that requires immediate action (such as a boil-water notice, missing child or evacuation notices). It then delivers our recorded message to a live person or an answering machine, making three attempts to connect to any number.

Noise Ordinance

Morrisville's Code of Ordinances includes an article regarding noise stating that: "the creation of any unreasonably loud, disturbing, and unnecessary noise is prohibited." This means that loud noises that may disturb your neighbors are prohibited. According to the Ordinance, examples of "unreasonably" loud noises include:

- Continuous playing of any radio, TV, sound amplifier system, or musical instruments at such volume as to annoy or disturb the peace.
- The keeping of any animal by which causing frequent or long continued noise shall disturb the comfort and repose of any person.
- The construction, demolition, alteration, or repair of any building other than between the hours of 7 a.m. and 9 p.m. on Monday through Saturday, except in the case of urgent necessity in the interest of public safety.

Non-Discrimination Ordinance

In March 2022, the town council adopted a nondiscrimination ordinance that prohibits discrimination in public accommodations and employment. Through an agreement with Wake County, all complaints for alleged discrimination in Morrisville are directed to Wake County for intake.

The Play Pool is a kid-friendly zero-depth entry spray ground with a play structure.

Temporary yard sale signs are allowed without a permit but must not be placed in public right-of-way and must not be attached to any traffic signs, service poles, such as stop signs, stoplights, or speed limit signs.

The Town picks up bulk items such as furniture and small appliances twice a year, once in the fall and once in the spring. Items can also be taken to the Wake County Solid Waste Containment site at 226 Aviation Parkway. This site does not accept hazardous materials such as paint or motor oil, or appliances such as refrigerators and computers. Hazardous materials can be taken to the South Wake Household Hazardous Waste Facility at 6150 Old Smithfield Rd. in Apex.

Trash


Garbage is collected every week on a designated pickup day. A black 96-gallon rolling cart is provided for bagged residential garbage. Only bagged household trash should be put in your container. Do not place yard waste, brush, construction debris, automotive parts, tires, hazardous waste, hot ashes, or corrugated cardboard in your container.

Recycling

Recycling is collected every week on a designated pickup day. A green 96-gallon rolling cart is provided for loose co-mingled recyclables. Overflow cardboard can be taken to the convenience center at 266 Aviation Parkway. Rinse and flatten recyclables to maximize the use of bin space.

Yard Waste

Residential yard waste is collected by GFL every other Wednesday based on the route. Sticks must be bundled, and leaves and clippings must be placed in paper bags to be collected.

To honor its past and create a vibrant focus for the future, the Town is working to create a Town Center. The full project is generally defined by the boundaries of Town Hall Drive, Jeremiah Street, Church Street, and a border running adjacent to First Baptist Church and Fire Station No. 1 from Church Street to Town Hall Drive. The council is comprised of seven members who are directly elected by the entire voting population, including the mayor who presides over council meetings and votes. Four of the council members are required to reside within the district which they run for, and two council members and the mayor are elected to "atlarge" positions, and may reside anywhere within the town limits. Council members serve staggered four-year terms.

Water is treated at the Cary/Apex Water Treatment Facility, a surface water treatment plant co-owned by the towns of Cary and Apex.



Northwest Park 998 Parkside Valley Drive

An open area for toddlers, a play unit design for 2-5 year olds, and a larger unit designed for 5-12 year olds are the features of this park. There is also a walking track built around an open play field and a rentable picnic shelter that includes restrooms.

Church Street Park 5800 Cricket Pitch Way

This park is home to a multi-purpose playing field, designed to accommodate regulation cricket matches. It also houses three tennis courts, a playground with a tot-lot, restroom facilities, a walking trail, and rentable shelters.

Shiloh Park 992 Church Street

> Located in the heart of the historic Shiloh community, Shiloh Park has a large picnic shelter available for rent, baseball field, basketball court, playground, and restroom facilities.

Morrisville Community Park 1520 Morrisville Parkway

MCP is located in the center of town and has a lot to offer, including rentable athletic fields, playground with a tot-lot, a large picnic shelter available for rental, T-ball, Little League and adult softball fields, and restroom facilities. It also connects to the Hatcher Creek Greenway.
